Program Length

Our Commis™ de Cuisine program typically takes 7-11 months to complete, depending on whether you are attending classes full time or part time.

Cost of Tuition

Tuition and fees for our Commis™ de Cuisine program is broken down as follows:

** The only item that students must purchase and is not covered by the cost of tuition is the cost of Chef Shoes. Kitchen-approved shoes typically cost \$20 - \$150.

Placement Rate Source/Methodology Description:

Placement Rate The placement rate, calculated by dividing the number of graduates (completers) employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment. "Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. "Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position. "Graduates unavailable for employment" means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education at an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
